Nature Play at Home – Lesson Plan



Lesson Title: Beautiful Butterflies

Supplies Needed: balloons, paper plates, markers, glue stick, green paper (leaf), white beans, rotini pasta, shell pasta, bowtie pasta, cupcake liners, clothespins, pipe cleaners

Lesson Activities:

Play quick intro game: Balloon Caterpillar Race

Supplies: Balloons and Pylons

- 1. Divide your family into two teams. Each person gets a balloon in between them and the person in front of them and behind them. Set up a designated finish line (using pylons)
- 2. The first team to get to the finish line without dropping any balloons wins. If a balloon is dropped, they must start over from the beginning.
- 3. If the kids think it is fun, you can do this more than once.



Lesson:

- Ask your kids what they know about butterflies (do they know the link between caterpillars and butterflies?)
- Hold up a picture of a caterpillar and then a butterfly. Ask: *Do you know how these two animals are alike?* And explain to the participants that they are the same animal, even though they look very different. This animal changes (*metamorphoses*) over its life cycle. Ask: *What does that mean?*
- Next, explain that we will be learning each stage of the butterfly's life. Share the words *egg, caterpillar, chrysalis,* and *butterfly* with the children. Ask them what order of the life cycle they think the words go in?
- Share with the participants that the animal's <u>main activity</u> in each stage using visuals. Ask the participants what order they think the life cycle of a butterfly is based on the pictures. Ex: what picture do you believe is of the egg?
 - 1. Egg: Growing and developing
 - 2. Caterpillar: Eating
 - 3. Chrysalis: Changing form
 - 4. Butterfly: Eating and reproducing
- After that, ask the participants what the life cycle of the butterfly is.
- Next, make the life cycle of a butterfly activity on a paper plate using pasta. Supplies: Paper plates, markers, glue sticks, green paper (leaf), white beans, rotini pasta, shell pasta, bowtie pasta.
 - 1. Using a marker, write "Life Cycle of a Butterfly" at the top and divide the plate into four sections.
 - 2. Have the participants glue a green construction paper (leaf) in each section. Next, the white beans on the top left, one rotini

- pasta on the top right, one shell pasta on the bottom right, and one bowtie on the bottom left. Glue.
- 3. Label each quadrant the correct terms which were discussed previously (egg, caterpillar, chrysalis, butterfly).



Craft: Make your own butterfly.

Supplies: Cupcake liners, clothespins, glue, pipe cleaners, markers

- 1. Open 2 cupcake liners and fold them in half, then fold them again and glue them together so they look like a bowtie.
- 2. Colour the clothespin and cupcake liners. Place clothespin over the cupcake liners.






