#### **BYLAW NO. 36 - 1985**

A BYLAW OF THE CITY OF SWIFT CURRENT in the Province of Saskatchewan to prohibit the operation of snowmobiles, jet skis, mini bikes, trail bikes, go-peds or all-terrain vehicles which, which are not licensed, within the boundaries of the City of Swift Current pursuant to the Urban Municipality Act, 1984.

## THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SWIFT CURRENT, IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. For the purpose of this bylaw, the term "Public Property" shall include but not be limited to all streets, roads, lanes, waterways, parks, public reserves, publicly owned parking lots, grounds of City owned buildings and City owned property.
- 2. No person shall drive or operate a snowmobile, jet ski, mini bike, trail bike, go-ped or an all-terrain vehicle on public property within the boundaries of the City of Swift Current.
- 3. Members of the City Detachment of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police are hereby authorized and empowered to impound for a period not less than five (5) days and not more than thirty (30) days a snowmobile, jet ski, mini bike, trail bike, go-ped or all-terrain vehicle being driven in contravention of this Bylaw. No impounded snowmobile, jet ski, mini bike, trail bike, go-ped or all-terrain vehicle shall be released unless the impounding charge and storage charges are first paid.

Bylaw No. 21 - 1999

- 4. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable, upon summary conviction:
  - a) for the first offence to a fine of not less then Fifty (\$50.00) dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) dollars;
  - b) for a second and subsequent offence to a fine of not less than One Hundred (\$100.00) dollars nor more than Three Hundred (\$300.00) dollars.;
  - c) where damage is done to property by an unlawful act under this bylaw, the presiding Judge shall adjudge payment of all damages occasioned by the unlawful act and the same shall be applied for the separation and reconstruction of the property damaged or destroyed.
- 5. Bylaws No. 6 1977 and No. 39 1977 are hereby repealed.
- This bylaw shall come into force and effect immediately after the final passing thereof.

INTRODUCED AND READ a first time this 7th day of October, 1985.

READ a third time and finally passed upon the unanimous consent of Council Members present this 7th day of October, 1985.
