## NOTICE OF CONSTRUCTION Your Street is Scheduled for Road Work

The City of Swift Current would like to advise you of upcoming construction in your area.

What does this mean for you?

This is a preliminary notice of paving work that will affect your street during construction season. You will also receive notice from the contractor when work is about to begin.

What work will be done?

## **CONCRETE PROCESS**

If your street is due for sidewalk repairs in conjunction with paving, these are the steps the contractor will be making:

**PREP WORK** – paint is used to identify concrete that needs to be replaced and any underground utility locations. **EXCAVATION** – old or damaged concrete must be removed

before concrete placement. This is typically a 2 to 3-day process.

**FORM SETTING AND CONCRETE PLACEMENT** – The forms are then set up and the concrete is poured. It needs to set and harden, then forms are removed. This takes 1 - 3 days. **CONCRETE PROCESS** – it takes 24 to 48 hours for concrete to cure enough for pedestrian use. The process can take between 7 and 28 days for vehicle use.

## **PAVING PROCESS**

These are the steps the contractor will be making:

**MILLING** – the old pavement surface is removed, typically one week before the next step. Parking restrictions are in place during the milling, which takes approximately one day.

**OILING** – oil is applied to hold the pavement to make the new pavement stick, which happens 24 – 48 hours prior to paving.

**PAVING** – a layer of new asphalt is applied. Two layers of asphalt may be required to make the pavement level with the gutter. Parking restrictions are required for the one-to-two-day process.
