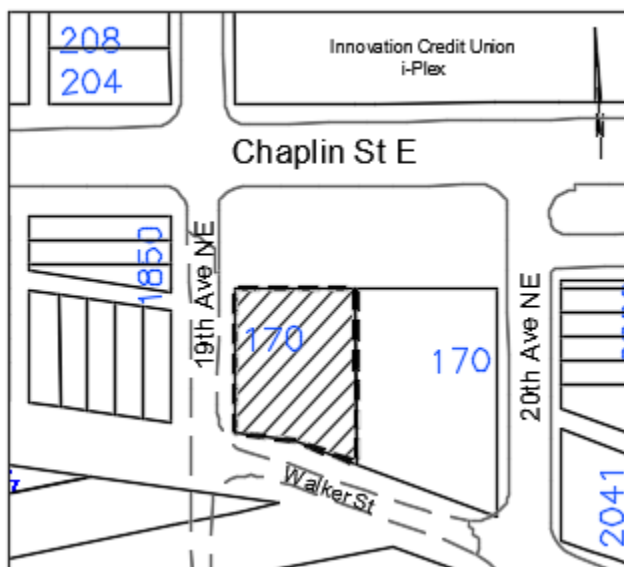

# City of Swift Current

## C.A.O. Report

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**Date:** January 4, 2022

**Subject:** **Paradise Plains, Megas 6, and the City of Swift Current**

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### **BACKGROUND**

In 2008 with the opening of the casino to handle the increased traffic, costly alterations were proposed to the existing service road. As an alternative, the City of Swift Current proposed the extension of Battleford Trail as a thru road to alleviate traffic on the service road. This eliminated the need for alterations to the existing service road. During this same time the City entered into an agreement with the adjacent property owners, Paradise Plains and Megas 6, for services to their property. This benefitted all parties by providing services to the adjacent properties and the needed thru road.

Initially these expenses were covered with an interest free loan between the City and the province known as SIGI Funds. The City has since satisfied its debt with the province. To date the property owners have an outstanding amount, with accumulating interest, due to the City pursuant to their above stated agreement.

The economy, location versus other available land, and at times difficulties in negotiating agreements quickly for potential buyers has worked against any possible sales.

### **DISCUSSION**

Most recently, Mayor Bridal and Administration met with representatives of Paradise Plains and Megas 6 seeking out various options to satisfy the outstanding debt of \$5,623,173.51.

A summary of the attached agreement is as follows:

- The property owners will pay the City the sum of \$500,000, plus the sum of \$500,000 from the first sale proceeds Megas 6 is entitled to;
- Both parties agree to transfer an interest of approximately 40% in their properties to the City; and


- Paradise Plains and Megas 6 will grant the City sole right to market the lands, in any fashion desired, with the ability to enter into binding sales agreement with potential purchasers.

It is important to note contained within this new agreement, the acreage price listed is not a price for land sales but was used solely to establish how the undivided interests were to be apportioned between Paradise Plains and Megas 6. Market prices will continue to dictate any sales as interest continues to accumulate on the balance owing and will still need to be satisfied.

Administration believes this is favorable to the City as it provides for some immediate relief to outstanding debt and allows the City to move forward in marketing the land with the potential for all parties to benefit from future land sales.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

THAT Council approves the attached agreement between Paradise Plains, Megas 6, and the City of Swift Current and authorizes the Mayor and City Clerk to sign the agreement.

THIS AGREEMENT EFFECTIVE THIS DAY OF NOVEMBER, 2021

BETWEEN:

**RONALD SIEMENS, MURRAY PRATT, GORDON BUDD, GORDON LANG,  
GLEN BUDD, CODY VICTOR LANG AND LANDON DANIEL LANG**

HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "PARADISE PLAINS"

and

**MEGAS 6 CAPITAL CORPORATION**

HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "MEGAS 6"

and

**CITY OF SWIFT CURRENT**

HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "CITY"

Paradise Plains and Megas 6 have ownership interests in the lands described in Schedule "A" (hereafter referred to as Springs Valley Commercial Area) consisting of 54.98 acres.

By an undated agreement signed on or about the month of August, 2008, Paradise Plains and Megas 6 agreed that the City would provide services to the said lands. Pursuant to paragraphs 4 to 6 of that agreement, the Owners were jointly and severally responsible to reimburse the City for the servicing costs by 5 equal annual installments with interest from and after September 1, 2013 at the Innovation Credit Union prime rate plus 2%. The said installments including interest remain unpaid and as of June 1, 2021, the balance owing for the services by Paradise Plains is \$1,688,521.90 and the balance owing by Megas 6 is \$3,934,651.61.

The Owners have proposed cash payments together with a transfer of undivided interests in the Springs Valley Commercial Area lands as settlement in full of the amount owing to the City.

The parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

1. Paradise Plains shall pay the City the sum of \$500,000 upon signing this agreement. Megas 6 shall pay the City the sum of \$500,000 from the first proceeds Megas 6 is entitled to pursuant to paragraph 10e hereof.

2. Paradise Plains shall transfer to the City an undivided 1692/10000 interest in Parcel E Plan 67SC01660 Ext 2 and Parcel I Plan 102050514 Ext 0 and Megas 6 shall transfer to the City an undivided 2138/10000 interest in the same said lands.
3. Paradise Plains shall transfer to the City an undivided 1679/10000 interest in Parcels 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 15, 16, 17 and 18 of Plan #102236688 and Megas 6 shall transfer to the City an undivided 2153/10000 interest in the same said lands.
4. Paradise Plains shall transfer to the City an undivided 814/10000 interest in Parcel 14 of Plan #102236688 and Megas 6 shall transfer to the City an undivided 3122/10000 interest in the same parcel.
5. Paradise Plains shall transfer to the City an undivided 1012/10000 interest in Parcel 20 of Plan #102236688 and Megas 6 shall transfer to the City an undivided 2900/10000 interest in the same parcel.
6. Paradise Plains shall transfer to the City an undivided 640/10000 interest in Parcel 22 of Plan #102236688 and Megas 6 shall transfer to the City an undivided 3317/10000 interest in the same parcel.
7. Paradise Plains shall transfer to the City an undivided 344/10000 interest in Parcel 23 of Plan #102236688 and Megas 6 shall transfer to the City an undivided 3648/10000 interest in the same parcel.
8. Megas 6 shall transfer to the City an undivided 4034/10000 interest in Parcels 13, 21, 24, 25 and 26 of Plan #102236688 and Parcel F Plan 67SC01660 Ext 2.
9. Paradise Plains and Megas 6 shall provide registrable transfers of title to the lands and the City shall register the same at ISC at its expense. Titles are to register to the City free and clear from any encumbrances other than utility easements.
10. Paradise Plains and Megas 6 hereby grant the City the sole right to market the lands set out in Schedule A or any portion thereof. The right to market shall include but not be limited to the following:
  - a. The right to seek and locate purchasers for all or a portion of the lands;
  - b. The right to advertise for sale the lands within Springs Valley Commercial Area;
  - c. The right to list all or a portion of the lands with a real estate agency provided that applicable commission is no greater than 5%;
  - d. The right to enter into binding sales agreements provided the gross selling price is \$215,000.00 per acre or more ("minimum price"). For the purposes of this agreement, the minimum price shall be adjusted on the fifth anniversary of this agreement and every five years thereafter to reflect inflation/deflation by using the rate of change in Consumers Price Index for Canada as published by Statistics Canada.
  - e. The net proceeds of any sale shall be deemed to be the gross selling price less real estate commission, legal costs and any other direct costs related to the sale of the land. The net selling price shall be paid to the City to be

distributed in accordance with the respective ownership interests. Provided however, the first \$500,000 that Megas 6 would otherwise be entitled to shall be paid to the City in accordance with paragraph 1 hereof. Paradise Plains shall apportion its share of the net proceeds in accordance with the provisions of its joint venture agreement.

11. The City shall accept said transfers and payments as settlement in full of the servicing costs.
12. Throughout the term of this agreement municipal property taxes shall be apportioned between the parties according to their ownership interests in the land.

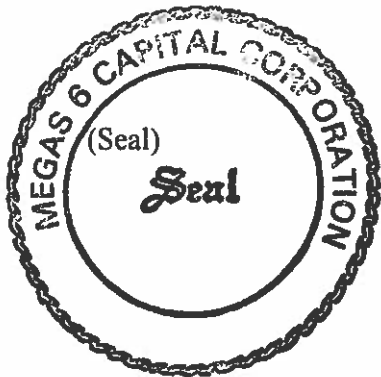


