Discretionary Use for Day Care Center at 406 Cheadle Street W

(Natural Wonders Early Learning Centre)

BACKGROUND

The City had received and reviewed an application from Natural Wonders Early Learning Centre for a change-of-use Development Permit to establish a Day Care Center on the main floor at 406 Cheadle Street W and improving the fenced play yard on the west and south sides of the property. This location is within the DC-C1 Direct Control Central Commercial District, which allows Day Care Centers as a discretionary use.

On May 2nd, Council approved a motion to give public notice of its intent to consider the proposed Day Care Center as a discretionary use at 406 Cheadle Street W.

DISCUSSION

Any proposed discretionary use requires Council to consider whether the proposed use conforms to the Zoning Bylaw's site regulations and development standards, will not be a source of nuisance or endanger the public, and will not impede the orderly development of the surrounding property. Additional procedures for public consultation are also required to assist Council in making their decision. This included:

- Public notice of the discretionary use being mailed to all assessed property owners within a 75-metre radius of the proposed development site and advertised in two consecutive editions of the Southwest Booster. This notice was also posted on the City's website.
- A public hearing was held during the May 30th regular Council meeting, where the Applicant appeared via Zoom in support of the proposal. There were no other presentations made at the hearing. One phone call and related written submission concerned over the proposal was received by the City Clerk.

The City has completed its review of the applicant's development permit (attached), feedback submitted during the public consultation, and other municipal land use bylaws to evaluate against the Zoning Bylaw's discretionary use criteria:

- Does the proposal meet the City's Zoning Bylaw Regulations? The proposed Daycare
 will renovate approximately 9,500 sq. ft. on the main floor of the building and improve
 the fenced play area on the west and south sides of the property. Minimum parking
 requirements for the Daycare and the other existing uses in the building will be addressed
 through a combination of spaces leased from a nearby business owner and property
 purchased across the street. A building permit will be required for the development to
 proceed.
- Will the proposal create nuisance and danger to the public? Based on the plans and supporting documents submitted by the applicant, there are no concerns with the proposed development regarding nuisance and danger to the public from a land use perspective. Although a concern was received regarding a potential increase in traffic due to the proposed development, the location is within the Central Commercial District which allows for land uses of similar or greater intensity.
- Will the proposal impede orderly development of surrounding property(s)? There are no concerns with the proposed development regarding the potential to impede orderly development of surrounding property(s).

After careful consideration, it is recommended that Council approve the proposed discretionary use and that a Development Permit be issued, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The development will be generally consistent with the plans and supporting documentation submitted as part of the Development Permit Application; and
- 2. The development is required to comply with all other applicable municipal, provincial and federal bylaws, standards and regulations related to or affected by the development's operations.

RECOMMENDATION

That in accordance with Zoning Bylaw No. 24-2014, the proposed expansion of the Daycare Center located at 406 Cheadle Street W, being Lots 13 to 15, Block 86, Plan K5486 be approved as a discretionary use, and that the Development Permit for a change-of-use be issued subject to the conditions contained in this report.





Dear Kathy;

As follow up from our meeting on March 1, 2022, we would like to give a brief description of our plans for the main floor of our building at 406 Cheadle St W.

The lease for the current tenant will not be renewed and we have applied to the Ministry of Education for an additional 77 licensed early learning spaces. The addition of these licensed spaces requires retrofits to the building.

Inside the building we will be required to add several square feet of windows, add a kitchen and an exit to the outside yard space to the west and possibly to the south. One the outside, we will be installing a fence around the west and south play space with equipment designed by a certified playground specialist.

We will continue to provide employee parking at the rear of the building, which also includes accessible parking.

CHEER FOR SASKATCHEWAN'S TOURISM INDUSTRY RECOVERY



The COVID-19 pandemic has posed unprecedented challenges to the tourism industry. Since the initial fallout in 2020, Saskatchewan has experienced a modest recovery.

There is optimism as total visitor expenditures and tourism-related employment numbers have seen increases. In **2020**, Saskatchewan had **\$1.50 billion** in visitor spending. There were **50,000 people** employed in tourism-related jobs that year. Tourism expenditures grew to **\$1.74 billion** in **2021**, with **57,200 people** employed in the tourism industry. Another encouraging statistic included hotel occupancy rates that rose from **32 per cent** in **2020** to **41 per cent** in **2021**.

Estimates for 2022 are not available; however, further growth is anticipated over the next two years, with full recovery to pre-pandemic levels* expected in 2024.

*Pre-pandemic, tourism spending in Saskatchewan reached \$2.7 billion in 2019. Tourism-related employment hit 71,100, and hotel occupancy rates were 56 per cent.
