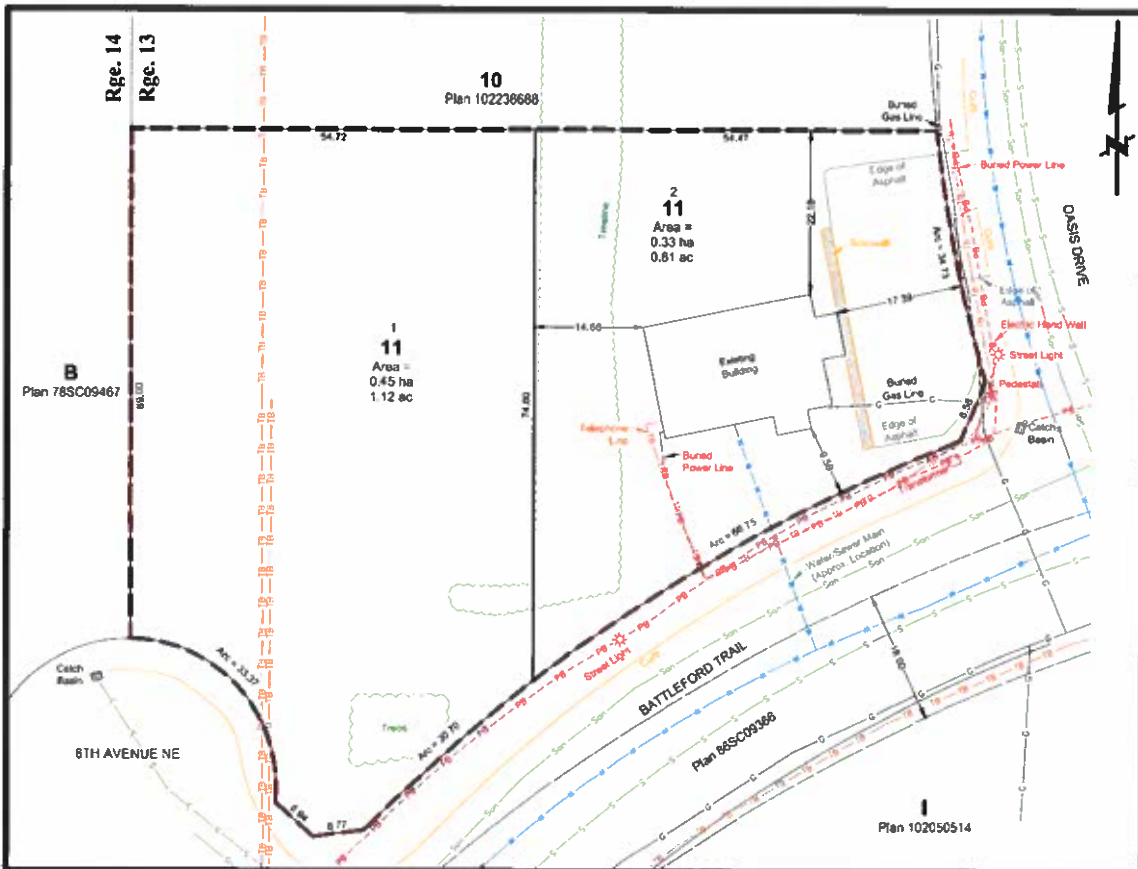

814 Oasis Drive (Bite Dental Studio)

BACKGROUND

The City has received an application to subdivide 814 Oasis Drive in the Springs Valley Commercial area. The property owners of Bite Dental Studio are proposing to create another parcel from the vacant area of the 1.9ac lot. This site is located in a C3 – Highway Commercial District.



DISCUSSION

The attached Plan of Proposed Subdivision will subdivide Block 11, Plan 102236688 to create two lots from the 1.9ac parcel. Lot 1 is currently undeveloped and will be approximately 1.1ac in size. The dental studio will be located in Lot 2 and is about 0.8ac in size. This proposal will accommodate the future sale and development of Lot 1.



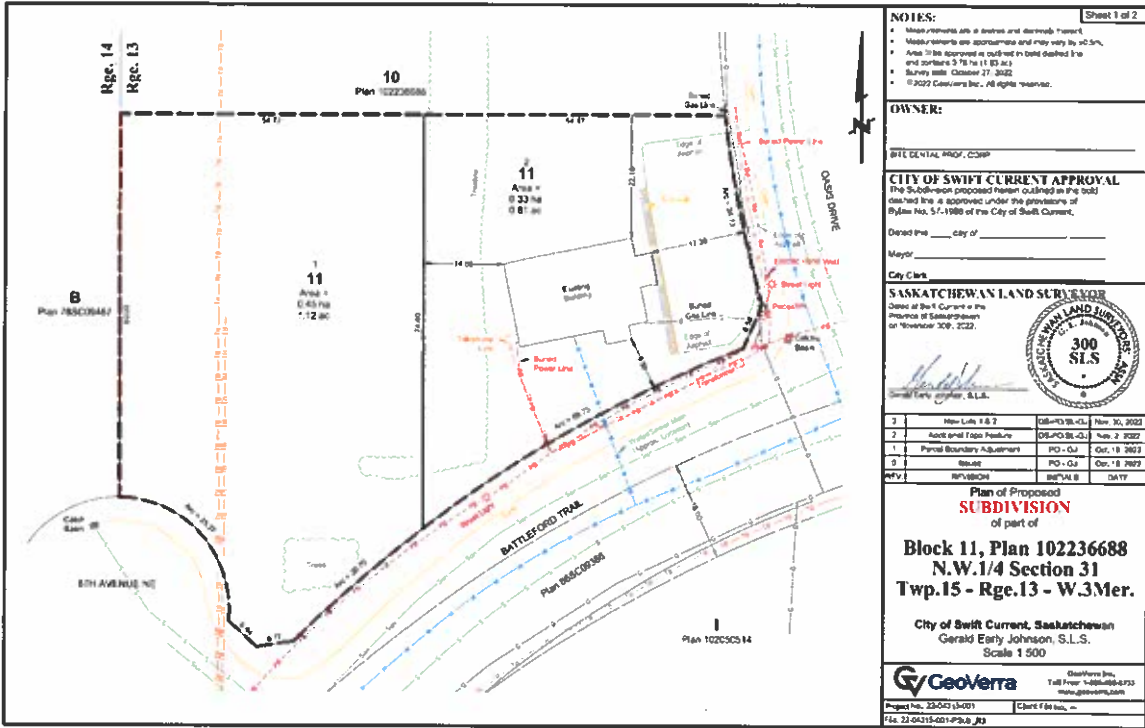

Subject: **Inclusive Playground - Park Play Surface**

BACKGROUND

The new Inclusive Playground, park play surface was included in the 2022 Capital Budget in the amount of \$242,410.

The City applied and received approval for grant funding under the Canada Community Revitalization Fund. The proposal included a fully inclusive playground, accessible washrooms, parking lot, and paved pathways. To meet the standards of an inclusive playground, a rubber “poured in place” surface is required. This type of surface provides wheelchair accessibility and protection for those with physical disabilities with a jointless plane, while also providing shock absorbency (fall attenuation), improved impact safety, and durability. In contrast, pea gravel and engineered wood fibers can be easily moved, which negatively affects the fall attenuation, limits accessibility, and becomes debris around the exterior of the playground.

When the play surface project is complete, it will allow full access to the playground regardless of a child’s level of mobility and comply with CSA (Canadian Standards Association) and ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials) standards for play surfaces.

Ground works started last fall with the bathrooms currently under construction, the play structure will be arriving soon, with the pour and play to be completed as progress allows. The anticipated completion date is scheduled for mid 2023.

DISCUSSION

A Request for Proposal was posted on SaskTenders and the City website on November 15th, 2022 and closed on November 29th, 2022. Prairie Rubber Paving of Imperial, SK was the only supplier to submit a proposal for the project. The references provided confirmed that they will provide a quality product and installation. Their submission meets and

exceeds the current ASTM and CSA Standards for shock absorbency and impact safety. They also include a 5-year manufacturer's defect warranty and a 5-year surface deterioration and cracking warranty.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council awards the supply and install of the rubber surface for the Inclusive Playground, park play project to Prairie Rubber Paving of Imperial, SK in the amount of \$234,623.36 (PST included GST excluded).

Subject: Canadian Cowboys Association (CCA) Event Finals Rodeo Write Off

BACKGROUND

The Canadian Cowboys Association (CCA) was founded in 1963. Annually, the CCA sanctions more rodeos than any other association, pro or semi-pro. It is estimated that just the sport of rodeo, in Canada alone, is attended by more than 1.3 million people nationwide. With the CCA recording over 250,000 attendees at both their sanctioned rodeos throughout the rodeo season including the CCA Finals Rodeo in October.

Swift Current was successful in their bid to host the CCA Finals Rodeo in 2015 with the annual event moving from Regina to Swift Current in 2016. From 2016 - 2021 the event was a major hit for the community with the first two (2) years of the event extremely financially successful.

Event hosting brings many significant benefits to communities, including economic boosts both direct and indirect. Direct spending by event tourists is seen at host facilities, hotels, restaurants, and entertainment venues, all of which stimulate the local economy.

According to the 2018 Regional Tourism Economic Impact Model (RTEIM) the CCA Finals Rodeo in Swift Current generated a gross estimated output by tourists on local goods and services in the amount of 3.49 million dollars with an estimated gross domestic product output of 1.75 million dollars.

Highlights over the years included visitors to Swift Current from Manitoba, Alberta, Montana, Kansas, France, New Zealand, Scotland, Australia, Germany, and England. The event had an average indoor attendance of 14,066 people and was hosted in part thanks to over 400 volunteers annually.

DISCUSSION

During the six (6) years of the event being hosted at Swift Current, three (3) different partnership agreements were developed to ensure the success of the event. The event was built on and relied upon the three-way partnership between the Canadian Cowboys

Association, the City of Swift Current, and the Swift Current Agriculture and Exhibition Association (Ag & Ex).

The first agreement signed for the 2016 - 2019 years was based on a profit-sharing partnership between the three (3) parties. Universally, a new model for event hosting was shifting the responsibility of a successful event from the host to the municipality. Large events were requiring a guarantee of financial stability should there be a loss in any year of the event. In 2019, a shift in the agreement transferred the fiscal responsibility of the event solely upon the City.

With the COVID-19 pandemic gripping all of Saskatchewan and Canada, the event was cancelled in 2020. In 2021, still under the shadow of COVID-19, the volunteer committee was unsure if the province's direction would be to open to indoor crowd-based performances. Therefore, the event was moved outdoors to Kinetic Park with a more realistic profit share agreement entered into for the year.

Over the five (5) year period that the CCA Finals Rodeo were held in Swift Current, the City recorded facility revenue losses of \$96,951.59 and cash losses of \$60,889.24 for a total of \$157,841.18. In relationship to previous hosting models, this financial loss would compare to the City sponsoring this major event to the tune of \$30,000 per year.


Upon review of the agreement in 2021 the City enacted the Notice of Termination clause which allowed one of the partners to opt out of the agreement, with the intent to renegotiate the agreement to provide a more realistic financial outcome.

The City's decision to invoke the termination clause was enacted as part of good fiscal management. With the COVID-19 pandemic, rapidly decreasing attendance, and volunteers, it was felt that the City's best interests were to at best renegotiate a new contract similar to the initial profit-sharing agreements.

In January of 2022, based on this renegotiation clause the CCA Finals Rodeo decided to move their finals to the City of Saskatoon for the 2022 season.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council approves the write-off of the City's recorded CCA Finals Rodeo loss in the amount of \$157,841.18 for the periods of 2016 - 2021.
